Project Redesign is for those interested in concepts of clothing construction and design and who may or may not sew.

There is no sewing involved in the creation of these outfits.

Participants will:

- Choose a project
- Sketch it out
- Gather materials and supplies (think anything you might reuse/recycle) needed to create your design

Bring your sketch and materials/supplies with you to State Contests

- Bring all of your materials with you; do not bring a final product.
- The final product will be made on campus during State Contests.
- You may bring accessories or props that you'd like to use with your newly created fashion item(s).

The session will begin by sharing your design sketches and ideas. You will then work in groups of 2-4 to create your fashions. Lindsey Shirley, Clothing and Textiles Specialist, along with collegiate Family and Consumer Sciences students are providing leadership of this track and they will be sharing some basic design concepts to help you as you engage in the activity.

Creation of a brand new item from reduce/reuse/recycle items is expected, not just embellishing an old one. You may use additional fabrics, trims, and notions to redesign and creatively embellish the new product. Finished designs can be displayed or modeled (by you or another) with appropriate props, accessories and coordinating items.

Before coming to State Contests, think about what you want to design, sketch it out to see what materials you will need, and always leave room for creative changes as you find things along the way or come up with a new twist on your design. Once you are in groups on campus, you may share ideas and resources.

Although Project Redesign is not a contest, a few designs will be selected to be shared during the Tuesday evening banquet.

Some basic supplies such as scissors, tape, and glue will be available on site.
